Did you know...

that SCI offers an apprenticeship option for students in Grades 11 & 12 who are sixteen years of age ?

- ✓ Students can earn up to 8 credits in the High School Apprenticeship Program (HSAP)
- ✓ Students are responsible for finding an employer who is willing to take them on as an apprentice and is willing to pay them for their time
- ✓ Students will be scheduled at school every second day in order to complete their compulsory courses (Math, English, and Phys Ed)
- ✓ Students will go to work on the other days
- ✓ Students will earn a credit for every 110 hours that they spend at their place of work - grades are determined using Apprenticeship Branch competency lists
- ✓ Students will be paid for their hours of work
- ✓ On the job hours can be applied to continued apprenticeship training after high school
- ✓ At a time when many trades are forecasting a shortage of employees, this is a chance to get a head start on your training!!
