## DRESS CODE REMINDER

With the nicer weather upon us we would like to take this time to remind students and their families about our school dress code as outlined in our school handbook:

Appropriate clothing is expected to be worn by all students in all school and school related activities. These activities would include extracurricular activities unless otherwise specified. In general, clothing deemed to be "appropriate" would be based on the following guideline: Clothing that would be acceptable in a polite business atmosphere in which the student could be expected to deal with the general public.

It is the intent of the Dress Code Policy that in addition to the above "general guidelines" the following will filter all decisions:

- Clothing must allow for safe participation in all school activities.
- Unacceptable print or images will not be allowed.
- No excessively torn jeans.
- No pajamas



- Clothing that is distracting or disruptive due to the “cut” of the garment will not be allowed i.e. Overexposed armpits, cleavage, belly buttons, undergarments etc. Therefore, spaghetti top straps and backless tops are not allowed. Shorts must have a minimum inseam of 10 cm.
- Hats and head covering are not to be worn inside the building, with the exception of those wearing head covering for religious or health reasons.

Students wearing clothing to school deemed inappropriate by the above guidelines may be asked to change.

## **ELIGIBILITY FOR SCHOOL BUS TRANSPORTATION:**



Your child(ren) may be eligible for school bus transportation to and from school! Students who reside within the limits of the Town of Stonewall and who live more than 1 mile (1.6 km's) from the school they are attending may be eligible for transportation to and from school. Transportation eligibility to École R.W. Bobby Bend School and École Stonewall Centennial School will be evaluated individually based on the distance to each school.

There may be situations where your child is eligible for transportation to École R.W. Bobby Bend School, but in following years, they would not be eligible to receive transportation services to École Stonewall Centennial School as they no longer meet the distance criteria.

The opposite of this situation could occur where your child was not eligible for transportation to École R.W. Bobby Bend School, but in following years, would be eligible for transportation to École Stonewall Centennial School.

Any additional seats will be filled on a first come, first serve basis, please refer to policy reference D-10(R2-F1) for clarification, also available on the ISD web site.
