SUMMARY OF SCHOOL GOALS FOR 2016-2017

École R. W. Bobby Bend follows the Interlake School Division strategic plan and aims to work on 4 priority areas: literacy, numeracy, building a positive, respectful learning environment, and intellectual engagement. We strive to deliver programming suited best to each individual's needs through a tiered model.

GENERAL SCHOOL PROCEDURES

The following guidelines are designed to provide a framework for an orderly and a safe school environment.

1. **Absenteeism and Lateness:** If you know in advance that your child will be absent, please contact the school by phoning or sending a note. We have an answering machine that will respond to your calls before or after office hours, which are from 8:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. (204) 467-5537.

It is very important that children regularly attend school and that they are on time. Chronic absenteeism and lateness are upsetting for the child and interfere with the learning process. **Students who are late must report to the General Office.**

2. **Agendas:** Each Grade 1, Grade 2, Grade 3, and Grade 4 student has purchased the student planner (agenda) to help him/her at school.

Purpose of the Planners:

- to teach students the basics of organizational and study skills
- to keep a written record of homework assignments and things to be returned to the school
- students may record and share memorable classroom events with parents
- to note special days
- to eliminate the "I forgot" and "I don't know"
- communication tool for afterschool care, absences and changes to contact information

Our Expectations:

- teachers will initial each day
- parents read and initial each night, even if there is no homework
- both teachers and parents may write in comments
- students must bring the planner to and from school each day
- students will pay a \$9.00 replacement cost if the planner is lost
(Cost will be pro-rated over the year.)

3. **Accident Procedures:** Any child who receives a minor scrape, cut, or bruise will be attended to by our staff. Should a child receive a more serious injury, the following procedure is followed:

- a) Parents/Guardians or the designated emergency contact person will be phoned. If possible they will transport the student to the family doctor or hospital.
- b) Should we feel that an ambulance is required, we will not hesitate to call one; the ISD has insurance so parents can be reimbursed for the cost.

4. **Allergy Aware:** There are students at École R. W. Bobby Bend School with life threatening allergies that could result in an anaphylactic reaction. In trying to make our school a safe environment for them, we are once again asking for your cooperation in being aware of the food products that you send to school with your child/children. In addition to knowing how to respond in an emergency, parents and staff also need to be pro-active in avoidance techniques:

- Avoid peanuts, nuts, and products with nut extracts within the confines of the school.
- Keep classrooms and eating areas clean.
- Teach children not to trade or share food.
- Instruct students in proper hand washing both before and after eating.
- Carefully monitor food coming in for special celebrations.
- Parents, staff, and students need to be aware about anaphylaxis, the appropriate action in an emergency, and the avoidance of allergens.

We will be teaching students about allergies in general and that not all people can eat the same foods; we want our students to understand why we are doing what we are doing and how they can help to make the school a safer place. Please watch for pertinent information about food and allergies which will be sent home from the "Allergy Aware" committee.

Also, should a student have an allergy that necessitates the use of an Epi-Pen, he/she will be required to wear an *École R. W. Bobby Bend School Fanny Pack* which contains the Epi-Pen. This will help identify the student to all staff members and will ensure that the medication is readily available if needed.

** If you are picking up your child after school, **please wait outside the school** as our halls are very congested at dismissal time.

*** If you **MUST** make alternate dismissal arrangements for your child, please try to do this in advance and send a note with your child. The Office has a difficult time dealing with daily phone calls on this issue due to the number of students enrolled in our school.

7. **Bus Policy:** All transported students will be required to go on the bus unless both the teacher and the bus driver receive a note/telephone call stating otherwise.

**** In the Event that a regularly transported student will not be going home on the bus, in addition to informing the school by note, please also contact the bus driver or Interlake School Division Transportation Department at (204) 467-8730.**

If your child is not a bus student but must travel on the bus for a special occasion (birthday, sleep dates, etc.), he or she will not be allowed on the bus without written permission and only if there is room on the bus.

Parents are asked NOT TO DRIVE INTO THE BUS LOOP as this may cause safety problems for our students. **Also, parents are not to park in the staff parking area to pick up / drop off their child/children.**

At dismissal, we load seven (7) buses that in some cases act only as shuttles to the high school. There, students may or may not have to change their buses for home. If you have any questions regarding bussing, please contact the Interlake School Division Transportation Department at (204) 467-8730.

8. **Calendar:** Each month we will send out a school calendar with school events on it. We hope that you find it useful and that it helps to let you know what is happening in our school. Please also read the back of the calendar for important information. Our calendar is also posted on our website – www.isd21.mb.ca/rwbb/.

9. **Canteen:** École R. W. Bobby Bend School is proud to be able to offer a school canteen for students to purchase snacks during first nutrition break (10:41 – 10:56 a.m.). Mrs. Harold operates the canteen and is an active parent volunteer who is very knowledgeable about food allergies in children and preparing ‘safe snacks’.
10. **Early Dismissal:** As part of an ongoing effort to improve achievement for our students, the Interlake School Division will be once again having one hour early dismissals eight (8) times during the 2016-2017 school year. Early dismissals will provide the opportunity for regular teacher group meetings at the school level. These meetings will focus on further development of instructional strategies to enhance student learning in all our schools. On early dismissal days, students will be dismissed one hour earlier than the school’s normal dismissal time. For families of École R. W. Bobby Bend School this will translate into the first bell (bus bell) ringing at approximately 2:15 p.m., with the second bell (town bell) to follow shortly thereafter. Early dismissals will be scheduled the third Wednesday of each month, except for the months of December and June.

11. **Electronic Devices:** The schools in the Interlake School Division recognize that it may be necessary for students to be in possession of electronic devices for personal use or for communication with family. However, the educational integrity of the school and privacy of others must be protected at all times; therefore, the following conditions will apply:
- All electronic devices must be turned off during class time unless otherwise directed by a teacher.
 - Inappropriate use of electronic devices in the classroom and/or common areas will result in the electronic device being confiscated by the teacher/administrator. Should an electronic device be confiscated, a parent/guardian will have to come to school to pick it up.
 - The school assumes no responsibility, in any circumstances, for the loss, destruction, or theft of an electronic device brought to school or to any school-related activity.
12. **Evaluations:** Reports will be sent out to parents in December, March, and June. Progress Conversation meetings will be held on the evenings of October 19th/2016 and 20th/2016 and February 15th/2017 and 16th/2017. Student-Led Conference will be held on May 4th/17. Parents are encouraged to contact the school at any time should there be a concern or question regarding their child’s progress.
13. **French Immersion:** If a student chooses the French Immersion program, French is the language of instruction for subjects other than English Language Arts.

14. **French Language in the School:** French Immersion students are expected to speak French in the school and are actively encouraged to do so. This enables the students to use the language skills learned in the classroom and become more proficient with the French Language.
15. **Guidance Program:** We are very fortunate to be able to offer a Guidance Program. Mrs. Sanche is our Guidance Counsellor and she will be conducting class programs as well as group and individual counselling. If you have any questions or concerns regarding these programs, please call Mrs. Sanche at (204) 467-5537.
16. **Library:** All students will be given the opportunity to borrow books from the school library. The loan period for books is one school cycle, so if your child's library day is Day 4, his/her borrowed library books will always be due on Day 4. Those students who have overdue books will not be allowed to check out another book on library day. It is recommended that students not loan their library books to other students. If the book is not returned or if the book is lost, the student who signed out the book is responsible for it. The library also expects to be reimbursed for lost or badly damaged books. This is the only way that we can maintain the size of the collection. Wherever possible, the cost of the new books has been entered into the computer, so we will charge accordingly. For older books, the charge will be \$5.00 for fiction and \$10.00 for nonfiction books. If you have books that you prefer your child not borrow, please contact Ms. Swain in the library. We hope that you will support us as we try to encourage students to read for fun as well as for information, and to be responsible users of the library.
17. **Lunch and Milk Programs:** Notices will be sent home to inform you of our Lunch and Milk Programs.
18. **Medication Policy:** The following is the School Board policy regarding the administration of medication:

Non-prescription drugs are considered to be medication and should not be administered by school staff.

If, under exceptional circumstances, a child is required to take **prescribed medication during school hours and the parents cannot be at school to administer the medication, the principal or his/her designate will only administer the medicine in compliance with the procedures that follow:

1. A written authorization by the parent or guardian is required before prescribed medicine can be given during the school day. A form for this is available in the school Office.
2. The medicine bottle must carry the official label from the pharmacist stating the child's name, physician's name, the name of the drug, the dosage to be administered, and if possible, the time of day it is to be given.
3. It is the responsibility of the parent or guardian to see that the medication is delivered safely to the school Office.
4. The medication must be kept in a safe place in the school and administered by the principal or his/her designate.
5. We encourage asthmatic students to keep and be responsible for their own inhalers.

19. **Nutrition/Activity Breaks:** Nutrition and activity breaks are provided so that the students are able to have time to eat healthy snacks / lunches and get some fresh air / exercise during the school day. We expect students to go outside for activity breaks. If a student is too sick to go outside, he/she is probably not well enough to be at school. If it is necessary that a student must remain indoors for a day or two, please send a note with your child. A doctor's certificate will be required if this must continue for a longer period of time.

During inclement weather conditions, all students will remain inside. Students are not permitted to leave the school grounds during nutrition/activity breaks unless they have written permission from their parents.

**** We encourage you to send a healthy snack with your child to eat at the first nutrition break as many students need this added nourishment (as do many of our staff)!! Please bear in mind our "Allergy Aware" initiative.**

20. **Parents in the School:** Parents and visitors are always welcome at the school and we look forward to seeing many guests visiting on a regular basis. **For the safety and security of all students and staff, we request that you enter the school through the main entrance and sign in at the office. Please follow the bear paws from the front door to the office.**

21. **Patrols:** Our school patrols have been out in full force at the beginning of the school year. Please obey these students and encourage your children to do the same. For safety, both parents and students **must** cross at patrol corridors.

During severe weather (heavy rain or extreme cold) we will NOT be sending out patrols. We ask that you exhibit extreme caution particularly during these times.

We also ask that if your child cycles to school that he/she walk his/her bicycle to the rack once having reached the sidewalks bordering the school. We also request that parents follow the same rule, as this is a safety issue during the very busy arrival and dismissal times.

For the safety of all of our students, please be aware and respectful of the parking / stopping by-laws and signs which have been established on the streets surrounding the school. Parking and/or stopping in unauthorized areas, creates blind spots for our children crossing the streets, and poses a very serious risk to their safety. We trust that we will have your full support in this matter.

22. **Restitution:** All staff are trained in Restitution and will be using this process to encourage students to learn self-discipline. We believe that everyone makes mistakes and that learning from mistakes helps us grow stronger. While we encourage students to solve problems, occasionally a student may work with his/her classroom teacher or a staff member for additional behavior support. For more information, please see the back of the handbook.

23. **School Climate:** At school, we will endeavour to be fair, consistent, and honest at all times. We will try to instill this in our students and we encourage you as parents, to do the same at home. Our responsibility as teachers will be to foster a learning environment

which is wholesome and healthy for each student. We hope that we can count on your support in promoting these ideas.

24. **School Fundraising:** Every year a fundraiser may be held to help subsidize classroom and school initiatives such as new technology for students, special guest artists, a new sound system for the school, etc. We realize fundraising can be a difficult undertaking however; we need your support to ensure quality programming for your children. We thank you for continued support. If you would rather make a donation instead of fundraising, we will gladly accept your contribution.

This is not to be confused with Parent Council fundraising activities throughout the year.

25. **Speech/Language Screening:** The Speech Pathologist will observe students within the classroom upon the Resource Teacher's request. If it is determined that a referral is necessary, parents will be contacted.
26. **Volunteers:** Volunteers are needed during the year to assist in various school activities. A Criminal Record Search and Child Abuse Registry check is required by all volunteers in the Interlake School Division.

Dear Parents/Guardians,

In alignment with the Manitoba Provincial Code of Conduct and the Interlake School Division Strategic Plan (Priority 2 Positive, Respectful Learning Environment), École R.W. Bobby Bend School's goal is to provide a safe, secure, and caring learning environment, which fosters students' personal growth, self-respect, sense of belonging, and prepares them to be responsible citizens.

At the beginning of the last school year, our staff was trained in Restitution 1. Parent courses were offered throughout the school division. We are now ready to share our school philosophy and processes in discipline and student conduct.

At École R.W. Bobby Bend School, we are now using a model of restitution as the basis of our discipline program. We believe that mistakes are opportunities to learn and our goal is to assist children to become the people they want to be. **Restitution is a growth process** for everyone involved, adults as well as children. We create the conditions for children to lift themselves out of failure and to leave behind blame and denial. A successful outcome allows a child to return to the group feeling strengthened.

Our program categorizes behaviours into three groups: *Above the Line*, *Below the Line* and *Bottom Line*. Students are expected to display Above the Line Behaviours such as being respectful, safe, and cooperative.

If a student makes a bad choice and falls Below the Line (ex. teasing, lying, defiance) the student will be expected to assume responsibility for the behaviour through the restitution fix-it process. The attached form can sometimes assist students in this process.

On rare occasions, students' behaviours can fall below the line repeatedly. As well, behaviours that are more serious and are totally inappropriate at school are considered Bottom Line behaviours. When a student demonstrates bottom line behaviours, it will require the involvement of administration, and parents/guardians and consequences will be generated for the situation.

As a school, we have already noticed success in using the restitution process. We look forward to continuing on the restitution journey together.

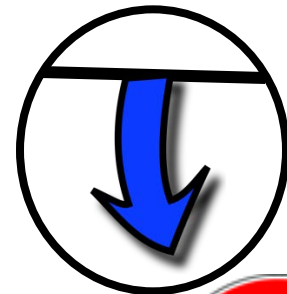

Notice to All Parents & Guardians

The Interlake School Division Transportation Department
welcomes you back for the 2016-2017 school year!

To ensure a safe and enjoyable ride this year for your child, please review the following:

- Take the time to go over the bus ridership rules with your child, and make certain your child understands them.
- Be sure your child is at their bus stop five (5) minutes prior to the assigned pick up time. (There is no waiting time built into the pick up schedule.)
- You must provide the driver with a **written** note if your child will be riding a different bus on occasion, or disembarking at a different stop on his/her regular route. As well, you must make prior arrangements with the driver if your child is bringing a friend home on the bus. The friend **must have a written note from his/her parent** to give to your bus driver, authorizing him/her to ride the bus.

Frequently asked questions:

What happens if my child misses the bus?... Have a plan in place for your child to follow in case he/she misses the bus, and make sure your child understands what to do. The bus will not return to pickup a child who has missed the bus.

What should I do if my child is late getting home?... If your child fails to return home at his/her expected time, contact the Transportation Office at (204) 467-8730 or the Bus Garage at (204) 467-2277. Please keep in mind there may be many reasons for a bus to be late (ie. mechanical problems, inclement weather or poor road conditions).

During inclement weather, how will I know if schools will be open or buses running?... We ask that you listen to any local AM or FM radio station. The decision to cancel school/bussing is made by 6:30 a.m. and all radio stations are advised by 6:45 a.m. Radio stations are your best source of information because phone lines may be busy.

Manitoba law requires all vehicles to stop for school buses when the loading/unloading lights are activated (these are the red and amber flashing lights at the top of both the front and back of all Manitoba school buses). **Motorists cannot pass a school bus when the school bus stop sign is extended!**

The flashing amber lights warn motorists that the bus is about to stop to load or unload students. When the red lights begin to flash, drivers meeting or overtaking the bus from either direction **must stop** before reaching the bus (unless there is a physical barrier such as a ditch or concrete barrier or median between the motorist and the bus). The motorist **must remain stopped** until the flashing red lights are turned off.

Remember, our students' safety is the highest priority and we all must be part of the safety team – parents, students, motorists, bus mechanics, instructors, and administrators.

RULES FOR TRANSPORTED STUDENTS

1. Students shall obey the driver promptly and respectfully. The driver is in full charge of the conduct of students on the school bus.
2. Students shall be held responsible for the condition of their seats. The driver has the authority to assign seats.
3. Students shall be at their designated stop five minutes prior to scheduled bus arrival time. (The bus shall wait if ahead of schedule.) Students shall follow all road safety rules.
4. Classroom conduct is to be observed. Students shall sit facing forward, and shall not stand or move about the bus while the vehicle is in motion. Ordinary conversation is appropriate. Loud or vulgar language will not be tolerated.
5. Students shall not throw garbage on the floor of the bus or out of the bus windows.
6.
 - a. Students shall not get on or off the bus except at designated points unless a note signed by their parent(s)/guardian or school office requesting a different stop has been given to the driver.
 - b. Extra students may only be transported at the discretion of the bus driver and will be transported only with prior approval of the driver.
7. Students shall not eat or drink on the bus unless permission has been granted by the driver and/or the supervising teacher.
8. Carry on items for regular school programs must be transported safely and shall **ONLY** be carried with the permission of the bus driver.
