Within this large and exciting framework, we worked on the improvement of reading comprehension at all grade levels, daily emphasis on mental math fluency, authentic learning tasks that nurtured the students' intellectual engagement, and the continued cultivation of a school environment that lived respect, understanding, volunteerism, diversity, responsibility, commitment and friendliness. Did we achieve all our goals? The answer would be yes and no. We had improvement in all areas, but we will always strive to do better; to keep improving, to 'raise the bar'. It was and teacher observation and student feedback confirmed this. The many field trips, classroom projects, speakers, and school assemblies also spoke clearly to this goal of authenticity and relevance to the global community.

Our school goals aligned and will continue to align with the division's strategic goal plan for 2014-2018. Our school goals will not be achieved in one year or four years, but we will always work toward improving in every area, towards making each year more enriching and more engaging for students than the previous one, and every year more memorable than the one before in the most positive ways. Change is a guarantee in education and that is not in reference to curricula, but to the learning that takes place daily in classrooms and within each student.

Thank you to our High School Parent Council. Your support and help has resulted in so much for the school over the years.
